As far as cleaning your home, the Internet suggests 1/3 cup all-purpose laundry detergent, 1 quart household chlorine bleach (must be fresh), 3 quarts warm water. I know some homes get dirty faster because of all the trees. We are doing our best to thin them out over time, but are specifically focused on the dead ones at this time.
